Ngā Aratohu Marae | Marae Guidelines

This guidance outlines the minimum constraints on gatherings held at marae under the different colours of the COVID-19 Protection Framework. Marae will decide whether to allow gatherings or those that are unvaccinated on marae. Restrictions will apply depending on the vaccine status of individuals or roopu (groups), followed by hygiene and cleaning practices in line with the public health guidance.

Marae at Kāraka (Orange)

- Record keeping and/or tracer app scanning required
- No restrictions on kai service – options like takeaway lunches or outside dining may be considered for unvaccinated groups
- Ringawera and kaimahi must wear a face covering
- Other rules around face coverings determined by marae

With My Vaccine Pass, the following applies: **Unexpected or planned gatherings**

- No limits on attendance

Without My Vaccine Pass, restrictions apply: **Unexpected gatherings (e.g. tangihanga)**

- If marae allow, groups of up to 50 unvaccinated people can attend but must be in a separate session from fully vaccinated groups and be followed by cleaning using public health guidelines.

Planned gatherings (e.g. wānanga, unveilings)

- Up to 50 attendees

Marae at Kākāriki (Green)

- Record keeping and/or tracer app scanning required
- No restrictions on kai service – options like takeaway lunches or outside dining may be considered for unvaccinated groups
- Rules around face coverings determined by marae

With My Vaccine Pass, the following applies: **Unexpected or planned gatherings**

- No limits on attendance

Without My Vaccine Pass, restrictions apply: **Unexpected gatherings (e.g. tangihanga)**

- If marae allow, groups of up to 100 unvaccinated people can attend but must be in a separate session from fully vaccinated groups and be followed by cleaning using public health guidelines

Planned gatherings (e.g. wānanga, unveilings)

Marae at Whero (Red)

- Record keeping and/or tracer app scanning required
- No restrictions on kai service – options like takeaway lunches or outside dining may be considered for unvaccinated groups
- Ringawera and kaimahi must wear a face covering
- Other rules around face coverings determined by marae

With My Vaccine Pass, the following applies: **Unexpected gatherings (e.g. tangihanga)**

- Up to 100 vaccinated people on marae at any one time (incl. whānau pani and ringawera etc.)
- Multiple groups of up to 100 people can come through the marae as long as the previous group have left the marae complex and cleaning has been carried out using public health guidelines
